Michael Eugene Cope, age 69, passed away Thursday, January 21, 2021 at Upson Regional Medical Center in Thomaston. He was born October 6, 1951 in Franklin, NC to the late Eugene Adams Cope and Ruth Roper Cope.

Along with his parents, Mike is preceded in death by his grandson, Noah Hudson who he had a remarkably close relationship. “ When people ask me about my childhood, the conversation always comes around to my big brother Mike. I often joke that I was raised by my mother and father and Mike. Most big brothers don't want little brothers around, but Mike was different. He dragged me along on most of his adventures, and through him, I learned a lot of important lessons that have helped shape my life.

From Mike, I learned patience. Little brothers are obnoxious by definition, and I certainly was. While there were the occasional instances of big brother justice (usually, a well-placed punch to the upper arm), Mike usually just ignored my whining or let me have my way and kept dragging me along. The love and patience he showed me was just a part of his nature that he shared with many of us, and I know I won't be the only one that will miss it.

Mike had integrity and a keen sense of right and wrong, and he taught me the big, important lessons that all kids should learn. While it was okay for us to occasionally trick our little sister Linda out of her fair share of Coke (little kids don't need that much sugar), it wasn't okay to be mean to others or be a bully, the worst thing a kid could be (and maybe an adult too).

I took over Mike's yard mowing business when at he got his first "real" job. I quickly learned that if I was going to keep his customers, I had to provide the same high quality work that he had provided. Mike believed that you do what you say you will and that you need to earn your paycheck. That he knew it at such a young age explains the man he became.

Our mother's family are known for their sharp wit and funny observations, and Mike inherited a full share of that wit. Much of our time together as kids and in the last year was spent laughing at his observations about life. As dementia took more and more of Mike away from us, his sense of humor stayed with him until the end. In his last few days when he was largely unresponsive, he still would say something funny that was obviously a piece of himself that remained until the very end. Being true to your good nature while battling a horrible illness is not easy, but Mike managed it. Another lesson to remember.

These are just a few of the many things I learned from my big brother. Throughout our childhood he dragged me along on adventures, protected me from bullies, and taught me the importance of patience, kindness, integrity, and a sense of humor. In his last years, he showed me how to face a horrible ending with humor and kindness. He was a good man and my big brother, and I'll miss him.
