January 18, 1937 - October 28, 2019

Richard Lewis “Dick” Day, of Senoia, GA passed away October 28, 2019. Dick was born in Kansas on his mother’s birthday, January 18, 1937, the fourth child of Kendall and Mary Louise (Clarke) Day. As a youth he held the Kansas City, Kansas middle distance track record and was an avid “birder” which undoubtedly contributed to his love of flying. Following his military service as a naval pilot, he joined an expanding regional airline in 1964 – Delta Airlines and retired as a senior captain in 1997.

Dick married the love of his life, Gayle Seeman in 1964. Gayle passed away on December 12, 2001 after a long battle with cancer.

Dick’s Catholic faith was a constant and strong influence in his life demonstrated in the way he lived his life, his love for family and in his interaction with his community. A member of St. George Catholic Church in Newnan, Georgia, he served for many years as an usher at the early Sunday morning mass. He regularly and generously contributed to various charitable and non-profit organizations and institutions. Further, he was a dedicated conservationist and outdoorsman. He enjoyed yearly hunting trips to the Dakotas and his native Kansas with family and friends.
