Mr. Albert C. Garlington, Jr., 81, of Augusta, Georgia and formerly of Newnan, died On April 14, 2011 at The Georgia War Veterans' Nursing Home in Augusta. He was born on November 21, 1929 in Balboa Heights in the Panama

Canal Zone to the late Albert C. Garlington, Sr. and Mary Wright Garlington. He was a graduate of The Citadel in Charleston, South Carolina. During his military service between 1952 and 1955 he served in The United States Navy. This was during the period of The Korean Conflict.
