Carl Hardaway Boone II, 73, of Grantville, passed away Friday, August 25, 2023, surrounded by family and friends.

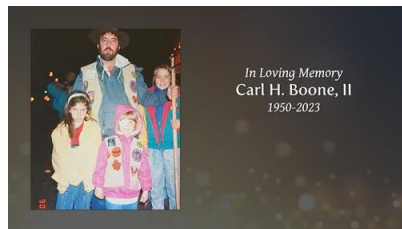
