December 24, 1951 - March 23, 2024

Carol Ann Hill, age 72, passed away peacefully on Saturday, March 23, 2024, at Piedmont Columbus Regional Hospital surrounded by her family. Carol was born on December 24, 1951, one of four children to the late Thomas F. Wilson and Lorene McGuire Wilson.

The funeral service celebrating Carol's life is Thursday, March 28, 2024, at 4:00 PM at Providence Baptist Church, 918 Providence Church Rd., in Newnan with Dr. Ken Norton officiating. The family will receive friends on Thursday from 2:00 PM until service time at the church.

*You granted me forgiveness, I do not pass judgment for it is not my place*

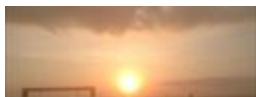
*You gave me the ability to learn patience. Well. You, Echo, and Emily. I still carry tennis balls in my gardening bucket*
