Dr. Clara Gaynell Stewart was promoted to glory at 2:11 A.M. Saturday morning November 21, 2020. Born June 9, 1933 in Rocky River, TN.

She was a Registered Nurse, retired Special Education teacher and Department Head for Fulton, County, GA for 34 years. She also served as the Greek and Bible College Professor at Immanuel Baptist Theological Seminary. She graduated from Bryan College in Dayton, TN. She also studied at Wright State, Ball State, Ohio State, and Georgia State Universities. She earned her Doctorate in Religious Education from Immanuel..

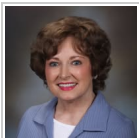
