Clayton J. Waugh of Newnan, went to be with our Lord on May 19, 2009 at The Charleston West Virginia Medical Center. A native of Vadis, West Virginia, he was born January 27, 1930 to the late Clayton L. and Wanna Mae Hickman Waugh; both of whom preceded him in death. Clayton was a man who took his obligations as a citizen seriously and served in The United States Air Force for over 10 years. Following his return to civilian life, he devoted 26 ½ years to Delta Airlines as both a mechanic and instructor for other employees. After making his home in Coweta County, Clayton and his wife, Janis, became actively engaged in the service life of Newnan's First United Methodist Church. He was involved with the Henry Kitchen's Sunday School class and was an integral part of the machinery that made the class's annual scholarship fundraiser such a success.
