David Duffield Deacon, Jr., “Duffy” Deacon-August 14, 1944- April 29, 2009

Wednesday, April 29, David D. Deacon, Jr. of Newnan, suffered a massive heart attack and passed away. He is preceded in death by his lifelong partner and wife of 43 years, Rita Deacon, who he lost to cancer in December. He is also preceded in death by his father, David D. Deacon, Sr. and mother, Carey Barker Deacon.

David, also known as Duffy, was born in Lynchburg, VA on August 14, 1944. He and his family moved to Newnan in 1950, where his grandfather, Rev. William Carey Barker, served as the pastor for First Baptist Church. After graduating from Newnan High School, Duffy attended Marion Military Institute, where he obtained an Engineering Degree. He also attended Auburn University. He married the love of his life, Rita Hight Deacon, and together they had four children; Kelly Gaddy (Phil Gaddy), David D. Deacon, III (Duffy) (Jennifer Deacon), Carey Deacon, and Natalie Deacon, all of Newnan. He is survived by his five grandchildren; Anna Alexander, Kimberly & Brian Deacon, and Catherine & Caroline Teeter. He is also survived by his brother and best friend, William Carey Barker Deacon (Billy) of Newnan.

Duffy worked for the United States Postal Services since 1975. He was a mail carrier for many years in Newnan, and was currently serving as Supervisor in

the Fairburn Post Office. Duffy was known for his love of God. He was an active member of his church, Harvest Park, as well as a Deacon and Sunday School teacher. Throughout his life, he has been a Christian advisor and mentor to many people. His greatest joy in this life was his family. He was a wonderful husband, father, and grandfather, affectionately known as "Poppy". Since losing his wife, he spent his free time with his children, grandchildren, friends, and beloved co-workers. Duffy was an avid football fan and enjoyed being with his son, namesake, and best friend, Duffy, as well as his second son (son in law), Phil Gaddy, during football season. He and his wife shared a deep love for animals and their pets. He was well known and loved for his wit, character, and kindness.
