



Dennis Alan Robertson

February 1, 1939 - January 19, 2025

Dennis Alan Robertson, 85, of Pensacola, Florida, and formerly of Newnan, Georgia, passed away peacefully on January 19, 2025. Born in Miami, Florida, on February 1, 1939, he was the son of the late Edith Louise Kirk and John Lawrence Holt. He was also preceded in death by his loving wife of 57 years, Diane Beattie Robertson; his stepfather, Edward N. Robertson.

Dennis spent formidable years growing up in Maine as a young boy. He attended Gould Academy in Bethel, Maine and graduated in 1957. Upon graduation Dennis traveled back to his hometown of Miami to join his father, working as a bellman at some of the finest hotels along the Miami strip. It was during his time working as a bellman at the Hollywood Beach Hotel that Dennis met the love of his life, Diane. His outgoing personality made him a perfect fit as a bellman, and he learned some immeasurable life skills catering to many different people and personalities.

Dennis continued his quest for learning by attending the University of Maine for several semesters before he felt the call of duty to his country. In May 1962 Dennis joined the United States Navy and began his military career as a Fire Control Technician on the USS James Monroe and later the USS Will Rogers - both were SSBN submarines. Dennis felt immense pride in being in the Navy and serving his country, and it showed every time he shared stories about the years he spent in the military, traveling the world, and protecting his country.

The experience Dennis gained in the Navy served as the platform for a career in the IT field that would span the next fifty years. Dennis was gifted in sales and spent the majority of his adult life in the Washington, DC area in various IT sales positions specializing in the Federal Government arena. He and Diane lived in the suburbs of Northern Virginia for over four decades and raised their three children there.

Dennis remained as an IT sales consultant even into "retirement" when he and Diane moved to Newnan, GA to be close to their children and grandchildren. Family was everything to Dennis, and he was always so proud of his family, especially his grandchildren. In his retirement, he was also a published author. Dennis wrote and published a book he promised his family for many years titled "Teddy Bears to Dangerous Missions." This book is an autobiographical journey that details his life and is a testament to the legacy he leaves behind.

He is survived by three children, Tom Robertson (Suzy), Erin Melton (Mark), and John Robertson (Stephen); five grandchildren, Hollyn, Luke, Claire, Ryan, and John Thomas; brothers Ned Robertson and Dave Robertson and companion, Helen Robson; and a host of family members and friends.

Visitation will be held on Friday, January 24, 2025, from 5 - 7 pm at McKoon Funeral Home & Crematory, 38 Jackson St., Newnan, GA. There will be an optional Rosary service immediately following the visitation for those who desire to attend.

A funeral mass for Dennis will be held on Saturday, January 25, 2025 at 10:00 am at Saint Mary Magdalene Catholic Church, 3 Village Rd., Newnan, GA. Entombment will follow at Camp Memorial Park, 1095 GA-54 E, Fayetteville, GA.

“ Dennis Robertson and I felt fortunate to be selected as members of the Gold Pre-Commissioning crew of the USS Will Rogers, SSBN 659, a '640 class' submarine and the very last (and maybe the very best!) of the original '41 for Freedom' Polaris Missile submarines. We had both Qualified as FTB1(SS) and were 'Plank Owners' on prior class boats. We felt privileged to have '2 bites at the apple'.

We 'rode her down the ways' at the launching (Electric Boat, July 1966) and spent more than a year helping to build-out and test her systems. We rode her on 4 sea trials and the shakedown cruise, including her maiden dive and first time at test depth. And we made 2 Cold War deterrent patrols. In all, about 2 1/2 years together and quite a few reunions since then.

He was a man that was easy to love and easy to work with and one of the best system troubleshooters I have ever known. His sense of humor and ability to help others graciously made him the best of all shipmates. We remained great friends and saw each other not often enough since 'the war'.

He had a gift of being able to quickly recognize a good idea and adroitly 'sell' it...no matter where it came from! I hope I have learned that lesson from him. He also had a gift of heartfelt condolences when I was asked to explain to the Captain some 'misunderstood team-building activity' in which we were both principles.

I'll miss him in many ways...I'll even miss his creative nicknames for me as much as his laughter at the ones I heaped upon him. His spirit will warm my heart forever.
