



Edmund Stephen Olszewski

December 4, 1929 - March 24, 2017

Edmund “Ed” Stephen Olszewski, 87, of Newnan, Georgia, passed away peacefully and surrounded by family in the early morning of March 24, 2017, at Piedmont Newnan Hospital after a brave fight with cancer.

Ed was born in Housatonic, Massachusetts on December 4, 1929, one of six children of the late Joseph and Katherine (Krzynowek) Olszewski.

Ed joined the Navy in 1948, serving in the Far East, the South Pacific, and the North Atlantic on battleships and aircraft carriers. After retiring in 1968, he worked at Roosevelt Road Naval Air Station, until returning to Massachusetts, where he worked for the Massachusetts Turnpike. He moved his family to Georgia when he took a position with the Frank H. Davis Company in 1979. He retired once more in 2001 and started an antiques business in Old Town Sharpsburg with his wife, Julie.

He leaves his loving wife of 48 years, Carmen “Julie” (Hernandez) Olszewski; daughter, Kathy Brown, and son-in-law Kelvin; daughter, Debbie Robertson, and son-in-law Sam; grandson, Clint Robertson; sister, Janet J. Soldati; brother, Robert J. Olszewski; many nieces and nephews, and many close

friends. He is predeceased by his sister Victoria H. Wool, and brothers, Francis "Ruby" Olszewski and Richard Olszewski.

Along with his love for his country, Ed enjoyed a good joke, the Boston Red Sox, travelling with his family, and of course, spending time with his grandson, Clint.

Ed will receive an official U. S. Naval burial at sea from the port in Jacksonville, Florida later this year. The family will be welcoming family and friends on Sunday, April 2, 2017 from 2-4:00 pm in the fellowship hall at Mount Gilead United Methodist Church in Sharpsburg, Georgia. A mass in his honor will be scheduled for a later date at St. Mary Magdalene Catholic Church in Sharpsburg, Georgia.
