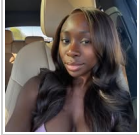

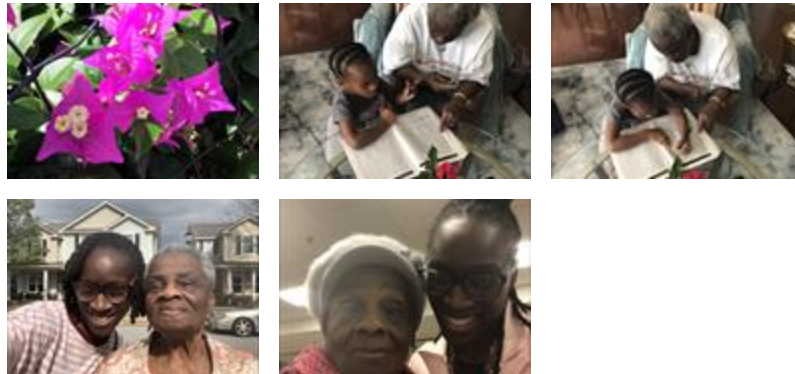

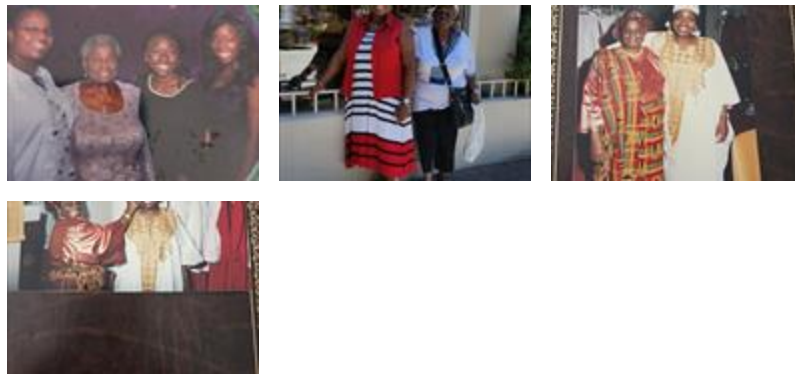

Aunt Emily was a woman of faith and discipline. Her faith was evident not only in the stories she told, but in the way she lived her life each day. Her discipline showed in her practice as a well-trained Registered Nurse, and as a devoted mother.

I remember one day when Aunt Emily gave me an injection. To my surprise, it didn't hurt nearly as much as I expected, based on previous experiences. I asked her why, and she smiled and said, "Child, I'm well-trained". Years later, when I became an RN myself, I fully understood what she meant. I still recall— and use— her technique for giving injections, with consistently good results.

Aunt Emily was also a woman of order. A friend recently reminded me of an incident that happened years ago at the Benjamin's home — an incident I vividly remember.

My girlfriend was visiting, and we had all gathered in Hue and JE's room, just chatting. Aunt Emily came home from work, walked straight into the room, greeted everyone, and then addressed my friend directly, respectfully, and softly: "Lil girl, I don't like girls in my Sons' room". She was serious, yet the moment was funny at the same time. My friend immediately exited the room, and from that day forward, whenever she visited, she knew to sit in the family room. She understood that Aunt Emily meant well—she was simply a woman of discipline and order.

My friend also remembered the scripture Aunt Emily had written on

her car, and we reminisced fondly about her when she called to offer her sympathy.

Aunt Emily loved the Lord, and her subtle messages—whether through scripture or story—were lasting, and influenced not only her household, but many others in a positive way.

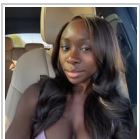

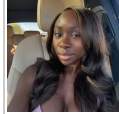
