“*Esther was sometimes loud, maybe even in Church. She couldn't resist giving you a nudge or a sharp poke with her elbow or a little pinch, maybe even a punch if you deserved it. She was a New Yorker and we are from NJ so we had this instant chemistry. Richard would tease her about being in the witness protection program because she was always hiding behind her tinted glasses with a scarf wrapped around her head and every inch of her body covered, even in the summer heat. She seemed like a fish out of water but as long as she was around people she was in her true element. If you were lucky enough to cross her path, you were lucky enough-because you know that you were loved.*

Attending two Masses every morning and sometimes one in the evening as well, spending hours in adoration before the Blessed Sacrament, praying at the feet of Our Lady, speaking to her as though she was her nearest and dearest friend, and constantly confessing her sins, just in case she may have been a little too “Esther.” In this midst of it all she still had time to care about you and all of your needs.

Esther was a unique and precious gem of a human being, always concerned for you but rarely mentioning her own struggles-she loved and prayed for you and for everyone you loved and prayed for. She was a cherished friend, trusted advisor, and faithful prayer warrior and her unwavering assurance carried us through Richard's 3 year battle with lymphoma.

Our hearts are broken that we were not aware that Esther had been suffering through her own battle since May. It was a busy time with family graduations, weddings, and out of state travel but we should have known something was wrong because she would always check in on us to see how things were going, assuring us of her prayers, and letting us know that she was there if we needed anything.

It is hard to express the depth of sadness we feel for the loss of her

presence among us, but Esther's light now shines all the brighter and her prayers are a heavenly hymn to God for all of us who were touched (and sometimes pinched or pushed or punched) by her love. May she rest in eternal joy.

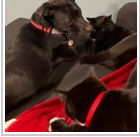
