Gregory Daher Mansour, beloved husband, father, grandfather, brother, and friend, passed away on February 23, 2026, surrounded by the love of his family. Born on January 31, 1950, in Newnan, Georgia, Gregory was the fourth of six children born to Marguerite and Taft Mansour. Raised in a close-knit family and community, he carried the values of faith, hard work, and generosity with him throughout his life.

Gregory graduated from Newnan High School and went on to build a life defined by initiative, creativity, and service. On March 31, 1973, he married the love of his life, Jill Corbett.
