Mr. Herman Mallard, affectionately known to his grandchildren as “Gandy” and many friends as “Moose”, passed away Saturday, May 18, 2019 at Piedmont Newnan Hospital. He was 87 years old. Mr. Mallard was born in Newark, New Jersey on June 4, 1931 to the late Kelly and Rosalie Porter Mallard. He served in the National Guard before joining the United States Navy at the start of the Korean War. Afterwards, he worked as an aircraft mechanic for Delta Air Lines where he later retired after 36 years.

He is preceded in death by his wife, Sarah Percival Mallard, his sister, Verna Dimiceli and daughter-in-law, Susan Mallard.
