Bill Ivey, 57, died Tuesday, June 01, 2010 at his home in Newnan. He was born July 5, 1952 in Atlanta to the late Robert Edward Sparks & Mattie Ivey Sparks.

Bill served in the Marine Corps from 1969 to 1973 and was in reconnaissance in Vietnam. He was the Lieutenant and Watch Patrol Commander of the first shift at the Coweta County Sheriff's Office.
