Mr. James "J.R." Claude Rivenbark, 76 of Newnan, passed away Sunday, July 23, 2017 at Southwest Christian Care Hospice. He was the eighth of ten children born to the late George Earnest Rivenbark & Esther Hamilton Rivenbark. J.R. was born January 3, 1941 in Willard, NC. In addition to his parents and five of his siblings, he was preceded in death by his wife, Loretta Fern Cross Rivenbark.
