



## James "Jim" A. McManus

October 28, 1919 - January 8, 2013

Mr. James A. McManus, age 93, of Newnan, died January 8, 2013. Mr. McManus was born in Kansas City, Missouri, the son of the late Joseph and Eleanor McManus.
