January 29, 1943 - June 10, 2010

Mrs. Jere Henderson Brady, 67, of Newnan, GA, died Thursday, June 10, 2010. She was born January 29, 1943 in Sarasota, FL. She is survived by her son, John D. Brady (Linda) of Clarksdale, MS and her daughter, Linda B. Taylor (Will) of Newnan, GA; as well as Debbie Wycoff (David), Ralph and Jim Brady (Joan); her sisters, Marsha Locklear, Karen Russell, Ruth Weller all of Sarasota, FL and Debbie Tomlinson, Largo, FL. She was preceded in death by her mother and father, her beloved husband Ben, and her sister Sandy Jantzen.
