John D'Arle Rhea, 85, of Newnan passed away Thursday, July 28, 2022 at Sacred Journey Hospice in Newnan. He was born August 15, 1936 in Armstrong County, PA to the late Robert D. Rhea & Mollie Dimit Rhea.

He traveled the world working as an international sales manager for General Electric and Yokogawa Corporation. John had a very adventurous spirit and never met a stranger, making friends everywhere he went.

He spent many years as a scoutmaster, had a passion for photography, camping and was an avid reader. His love of nature was demonstrated through his ability to identify butterflies, snakes and plants. John was always a problem solver. Never spending a penny on something he could fix himself. But by far his biggest passion was his family. In later years he spent time with his grandchildren going on one adventure after another.

John was a longtime, active member of Cornerstone United Methodist Church in Newnan.

The memorial service is 6:00 pm Tuesday, August 2, 2022 at Cornerstone United Methodist Church with Rev. Joe Watson & Dr. Brian Germano officiating. 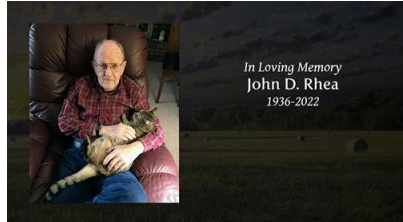

I am Bobbi Deling, John and Betty Rhea's middle daughter. I spoke during my father's memorial service. My family requested I share this online for others to enjoy reading.

Thank you for coming out today to celebrate and remember my father. Dad loved all people and always had a knack for assessing a situation and evaluating what was needed. I wanted to share one particular story with you to demonstrate these qualities in my father. He was on business down in Mexico. Traveling in a rental car, he came to a place where he would need to cross a river by ferry. Unfortunately, the ferry was delayed for an hour or two. Many local folks were also waiting on the ferry. So, dad got out of the car to stretch his legs. Meanwhile, a few unsavory looking characters came over to his car, drinking beer, sitting, and leaning on his car. Dad did not speak the language and was the only American waiting for the ferry. The situation could have been a little concerning but not for my dad. There were many children out and about and so my father sat down on a grassy hill. He proceeded to use blades of grass to make whistles. Soon, the children came over and sat with my father, allowing him to demonstrate how to make a whistle using a piece of grass. Before he knew it, the unsavory folks on his car became as friendly as could be and offered him a beer. Language barrier or not, Dad could communicate with anyone. Traveling the world for business, he used his expert people skills to not only sell products but made friends wherever he went.

Dad had some different interests and truly followed his passions. Not only did he enjoy photography but he also developed his own photographs in a dark room he set up in our house. He loved animals and critters, having pets of all kinds as a boy. My father's curious nature extended into his adult life. He went through a period of time here in Georgia where he enjoyed catching mice in the basement. He bought cages and fed them. I'm not sure how my mother felt about this but as long as he kept them in the basement it

was okay with her. Once on a trip back home to Pennsylvania, he had the great pleasure of catching what is called a kangaroo mouse. He decided this was an opportunity. If he could get this kangaroo mouse home to Georgia, he could try to breed it with his basement mice and see what happens. Maybe he could create a new mouse species! Well, Dad got that kangaroo mouse back home. He tucked that mouse into his shirt pocket and boarded his flight back home. The kangaroo mouse slept the entire flight. Dad had no worries the mouse would get loose on the plane as mice are nocturnal and it would just sleep. Thank goodness he was right!

We will certainly miss him dearly until we are together again.
