



John P. Sides, Jr.

November 1, 1936 - May 13, 2024

John Paul Sides, Jr. died Monday, May 13, 2024, surrounded by the love of his family. Born on November 1, 1936, in Walker County, Alabama, John lived a life of service, allowing him an honest application of the epitaph, "He left the world a better place than he found it."

After graduating from Oakman High School, John attended Florence State University (now the University of North Alabama), where he met his wife of sixty seven years, Claudette. After college, John was commissioned as an officer in the U.S. Army and achieved the rank of Captain. His military career took him to Texas, Hawaii, California, and Thailand, and provided him with not only his impeccable posture and impressive personal discipline, but also with stories of true-life adventures that entertained generations of his family and friends. After leaving the military, John became a teacher, coach, and eventually, a principal. At a time of great division, John was a unifying force, helping to desegregate schools in Alabama. His efforts were so successful, he was recruited to do the same in Newnan, and served as principal at Madras, Ruth Hill, Central, and White Oak schools. John built a community of friends based on service, faith, football (Roll Tide), and tennis. John was an active member of First Methodist Church; he sang in two choirs and taught the Henry Kitchens Sunday School Class for many years.

Of all his achievements, the nearest to his heart was his family. John was the

type of man who taught his children and grandchildren by example, and who was always ready to tell a joke, have an adventure, play a game, or give wise, thoughtful advice. He made sure those he loved knew he loved them, and his steadfast dependability made him a rock of his community and family. John is survived by his wife, Claudette; daughter, Toni Brown; son, John Paul Sides, III (Beau) and his wife Leah; granddaughter Lauren, and her husband Bennett; and grandson Justin, and his wife Sarah. He will be missed.

The service for John will be Saturday, May 18th at First United Methodist Church at 2:00 pm, with a reception following in the Annex Hall. Flowers are welcome, or contributions may be made to Global Partners in Life
