Larry David Wheeler, age 83, passed away unexpectedly in the early morning hours on Tuesday, January 9, 2024, at his home in Newnan. Larry was born on March 5, 1940, in Cedartown, Georgia. Larry was the youngest of five children born to the late Roy and Cora Miller Wheeler.

Larry served in the United States Air Force after high school. After his time in the military, Larry went to work for the Georgia State Patrol and was stationed at the Newnan Post. He then went to the Georgia Bureau of Investigations (G.B.I) where he served and worked as a state employee for over 30 years. Larry retired as the Assistant Deputy Director.
