September 12, 1921 - September 9, 2010

Mrs. Lucille Mapp of Newnan died on Thursday, September 9, 2010, at Piedmont Fayette Hospital.

Born Edna Lucille Phillips in Douglasville, Georgia, on September 12, 1921, the third of fifteen children, Mrs. Mapp moved to Newnan with her family during her childhood.

A member of Mills Chapel Baptist Church at the time of her death, Mrs. Mapp will be remembered for her abiding love for her large family, numerous friends, and especially her Lord. During her earlier membership at East Newnan Baptist Church, she taught a youth Sunday School class and later a ladies' class. She gave of her time freely, baking cakes for local nursing home residents and sharing her love with them. During her lifetime she worked for Playtex Industries, American Can Company, Kessler's Department Store, and did private care for the elderly.
