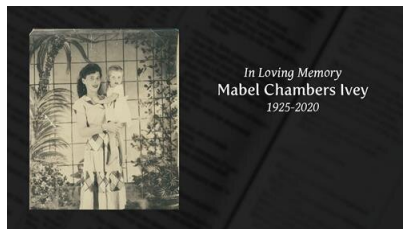

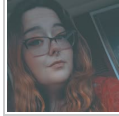

After that day she no longer acted like she didn't want me to bother her... She became one of my favorite people. She would laugh at me being goofy and she made me laugh when she thought I wasn't in a good mood. Mrs Mabel helped me understand that there is always something you can do to make someone more comfortable, or to make them feel more important in my line of work. I have used my "nail salon" technique only a few times but she is the reason I use it. She made me try to think of new ways to help people. I will miss her, deeply.
