



## Mary "Pat" Brown

June 10, 1931 - January 26, 2023

Mrs. Mary "Pat" King Brown, 91, of Newnan, Georgia, formerly of Fredericksburg, Virginia and Millville, New Jersey, passed away peacefully Thursday, January 26, 2023 at Monarch House Assisted Living, Newnan, Georgia. She was born June 10, 1931 in Teaneck, New Jersey to the late William Warren King and Mary Margaret Fogarty King. In addition to her parents, she was preceded in death by her husband, Wiley Virgil Brown, Jr, who passed August 2008.

Pat grew up in Bergen County, New Jersey. Married Virgil Brown, September 1950. They raised five children and lived in College Park, Georgia; Miami, Jacksonville, and Hialeah, Florida until 1969. The family then moved to Marlboro, New Jersey and ultimately Millville, New Jersey in 1974. In 2014, she relocated to Fredericksburg, Virginia to be closer to family. In early 2021, she moved into Monarch House Assisted Living, Newnan, Georgia.

Beyond being a loving wife of 58 years and wonderful mother, she worked as a financial advisor and worked for the family's business, M&R Products, Vineland-Millville, New Jersey until the business was sold in 2004.
