After graduating high school, he worked full time at Kroger and attended college full time in Carrollton.

He served his country by joining the National Guard November 1964 and served until November 1970.

After college Mickey went to work for West Point Pepperell in Valley, AL. He realized real quick that was not the job for him. He then went to work for Sinclair Refining Company as a sales rep. Mickey loved the oil business and was able to achieve his lifelong goal of becoming a jobber when he and his business partner bought Powell Oil Co. in Austell, GA. After operating a successful Texaco and Marathon jobbership, they sold the business in 2000 and were able to retire.
