Otis Ceylon "O.C." Thompson, Sr., 90, died on Saturday, October 24, 2009 at Newnan Nursing & Rehabilitation. He was born in Fayette County, GA to the late Otis Thatcher Thompson & Beauty Mae Brown Thompson. He served in the United States Army as a decorated Corporal during WWII with the 109th Infantry. He stormed Omaha Beach on D-Day in the Battle of Normandy & was a part of the Northern France Campaign. He later owned the OC Thompson Grocery on Highway 29 in Newnan. In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by brother, Howard Thompson; infant daughter, Elaine Thompson; and infant grandson, Benny Grubbs.

The funeral service is Sunday, October 25, 2009 at 4:00 pm in the Chapel of McKoon Funeral Home with Rev. Dan Dixon & Rev. Mike Ayers officiating.
