On Friday, March 13, 2020, Patrick Ben McEwen lost his two-year battle with cancer at age 63.

Pat was born on May 7, 1956 in Atlanta, Georgia to Ben Camp and Francis Jurelle (Bolton) McEwen. He graduated from Campbell High School in 1974. Pat was an employee of Owens Corning in Fairburn for 41 years and held the position of Utilities Group Leader until his retirement in 2017. On December 31, 2010, he married Glenna Stapleton.
