



Richard Thomas Bentley

January 22, 1926 - November 28, 2017

Richard Thomas Bentley slipped peacefully into his life eternal on November 28, 2017. The Bentley family had a storied history in Maryland. Richard was one of two children born to the late Richard Thomas Bentley, Sr. and Rhea Margaret Lucas Bentley. In addition to his parents, he was predeceased by his sister, Virginia Bentley Weems and a step-son, Joseph Righton Robertson, III. After it became apparent that there would be a war in Europe, Richard, like many other young men of the day, stretched the truth somewhat about his age to enlist in the Army before his 18th birthday. During the war, he served as a Browning Automatic Rifleman in the 63rd Infantry Division. He saw combat in France, Alsace-Lorraine and Germany. For his efforts, he was awarded three battle stars and a combat infantry badge. After returning from the war, he attended the University of Baltimore on the G.I. Bill and graduated with a degree in Management. For a number of years, he worked for the Small Business Administration in Baltimore, Maryland and then in Washington, D.C. Some of the positions he held were Loan Officer, Deputy Director of Program Analysis, Director of Disaster Operation and Director of Field Review. During the years with SBA, he made his home in Bowie, Maryland. Among the many accomplishments in his life, The earthly journey of Richard Thomas Bentley, Jr. began January 22, 1926 in Baltimore, Maryland. Richard considered his 40-year commitment to and involvement in Alcoholics Anonymous as his proudest achievement. Following his retirement, he made his home in Newnan, GA and later, Peachtree City, GA. Surviving Richard is his wife, Ann

Robertson Bentley of Peachtree City and a son, Chad Taylor Bentley of Crofton, Maryland. Also surviving are step-children Frank H. S. Robertson of Tallahassee, Florida; Stephen Heard Robertson and his wife Sheryl of Keller, Texas; William McPherson Roberts, Sr. and his wife Carrie of Bowie, Maryland; Helen Robertson Rivers and her husband Todd of Newnan, GA. The grandchildren include Shannon Joanne Bentley, Sarah Marie Bentley, Alycia Katharine Robertson, Andrew Miller Robertson, Ean Thomas Robertson, Rebecca Lynn Robertson, William McPherson Robertson, Jr. Amelia Banks Rivers, Ann Seiler Rivers and James Righton Rivers.
