September 15, 1918 - June 26, 2012

Mr. Robert Elgin Lee, 93, of Newnan died Tuesday, June 26, 2012 at his home. He was born September 15, 1918 in Newnan to the late Dock Richard Lee & Bloise Stamps Lee.

Mr. Lee graduated in 1936 from Starr High School in Sharpsburg before joining the U.S. Navy and serving during WWII. After his military service he worked as a flight engineer with Pan American World Airways. He was a longtime member of Newnan Presbyterian Church and a charter member of the White Oak Golden K Kiwanis Club.

The funeral is Saturday, June 30, 2012 at 11:00 AM at Newnan Presbyterian Church, 38 Greenville St, Newnan with Dr. Harry Barrow officiating. Burial will follow at Oak Hill Cemetery.
