



Thomas Allen Carroll

April 15, 1923 - November 5, 2009

Mr. Thomas Allen Carroll, age 86, of Moreland, died November 5, 2009 at WellStar Douglas Hospital. A native of Coweta County, he was born April 15, 1923 near Grantville, Georgia. He was one of seven children born to the late Joseph and Pearly Deloris Payton Carroll. His brothers and a sister preceded him in death, as did his parents.
