“ Dear Jennifer, Ansley, Gustavo, and Cameron. Please accept our deepest sympathy for your loss. I remember the day Tim was born. For some reason it is one of those memories that you replay in your mind over and over thru the years. I will never forget Maxine telling us that we had a baby brother. Sonya, I and the neighbor's kids ran around in the yard and celebrated until dark. We had just returned from living in Australia for 3.5 years and his birth and Ryan's two years later made our lives feel more complete. There was never a dull moment in those early years. It was like organized chaos. We had so much fun at sporting events, Stone Mountain Park, and summers in Florida (Palm Harbor/Dayton/Ponce Inlet). I remember having to tell Tim and Ryan after one of their high school football games that Dad had a heart attack and was in ICU in Florida. Tim handled it extremely well. I remember Tim's first job in Conyers was installing stereos and car phones which eventually led to his job at Verizon. He was great at it and could climb in the back of a truck like he was made of rubber. He installed my first car phone in my Nissan 300ZX twin turbo. It was my favorite car, and I just thought the phone in the car was so cool. It was the first true mobile phone. It worked perfectly the entire time I owned the car. Thru the years he always helped me fix things around the house or offer advice on anything technical especially with mobile devices. For many years I had a Samsung while everyone else on the planet had an I-Phone. He always helped me with Deb and J2's phone especially after a trade in. I can't say Tim and I were close. Maybe it was the age difference or different lifestyles, but we were always there for each other when needed. We would always pick up where we left off. The one thing we had in common was putting our family first and being dedicated to our profession. He loved his family and his career at Verizon. I wish that we would have both found time to play a round of golf together, but it wasn't meant to be. Tim lived life the way he wanted and was totally dedicated to his family. I know he lived a very happy life, and his tribute was evidence of that! Rest in Peace little brother. You will be missed but never forgotten. We love you.
