



Vernon "Mutt" Hunter

May 12, 1929 - May 19, 2017

Sidney Vernon "Mutt" Hunter, age 88, passed away Friday, May 19, 2017 at his home in Senoia, GA surrounded by his family. He was born May 12, 1929 in Turin to the late Sidney Richard Hunter and Nancy Young Hunter. In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by his wife of 63 years Sue Gantt Hunter and siblings Joseph Young Hunter, Mary Ellen Spearmen, J.T Hunter and John Hunter.

Mutt was a mainstay in Coweta County and his fingerprints can be found on much of the progress of it. He proudly served Coweta County in several capacities for over 38 years. Mutt began his career with Coweta County as a correctional officer and retired after serving 26 years as the County Administrator. After retirement, he served as a County Commissioner for three terms and was the Commission Chairman several times.

The funeral service is Sunday, May 21, 2017 at 2:00 PM at White Oak Associate Reformed Presbyterian church with Dr. Tom Shoger and Rev. Winston Skinner officiating. Burial will follow in the church cemetery. The visitation is Saturday evening from 5 PM until 8 PM at McKoon Funeral Home, 38 Jackson Street, in Newnan. “ As Administrative Assistant (Secretary) at The Hunter Complex, I am very proud to have gotten to know Mr. Mutt and Miss Sue and some other members of his family including his grandsons - Sid and Rick. When i interviewed for my job to be "Sectetary / Receptionist" at The Hunter Complex, Mr. Mutt was asked by my boss Carl McKnight, if he knew me and Mr. Mutt didn't recall knowing who I was. I also must mention a lovely lady and friend, Miss Annette Perkins, that encouraged my employment with the Recreation Dept. when i had my interview. My husband n i new who Mr. Mutt was, and he was our commissioner. As I learned later, it was a "plus" that Mr. Mutt didn't recall who I was, as it was mostly those that had become a bit of an "aggravation" that stuck in his mind. Mr. Mutt and I got to know one another better after I became an employee, and I feel so very fortunate to have had that opportunity. Once he helped my family with a situation concerning our Road name that happened to get misspelled once one of the road signs disappeared. I called my boss, Carl McKnight and told him about the situation and explained how it was important to our family because the road was named after my husband's father and the road name was misspelled when the sign was replaced. Carl immediately called Mr. Mutt and Mr. Mutt immediately contacted whomever necessary and almost immediately our family road name was corrected and has remained correct. We were very appreciative to get this corrected and I acknowledged it, although it may have not seemed important to others, Carl and Mr. Mutt realized it was to us and we were grateful. I always enjoyed visits with Mr. Mutt as time went on and we got to know each other better. I know he missed Miss Sue desperately, and although I will certainly miss Mr. Mutt, I'm comforted, as i hope his family is, to know he's in a better place and with Miss Sue and other loved ones now. It is my hope that I had a small part in making Mr. Mutt proud of The Hunter Complex, which has certainly served many youth and adults over the years, and hopefully will for years to come.

“ I just want to say that I have known Mr. Hunter since the late 1960's when I played sports at East Coweta. His daughter Pam was active in cheerleading. Mr. Hunter and Ms. Sue were always there at the old high school at every event (the middle school) I have always called him Mr. Hunter just because of the respect that I have for him. Later on, Mr. Hunter started doing business with me, my dad, and my granddaddy buying supplies from our fertilizer company. One day, he said "son you come from a respectful family, you don't have to call me Mr. Hunter all the time, you can call me Mutt. So from that point on, I called him Mr. Mutt. Mr. Mutt had a running joke about new vehicles. He used to drive a 1956 International. Whenever he would come down to our business, the truck didn't seem to be that old back then. It was always a running joke between he and my dad about his old truck. Somewhere in between tearing down the old county jail, I think he might have gotten a raise according to Paul McKnight Jr. He said I believe mutt got a new truck. I believed my dad, but I wanted to see it for myself, so I drove to Turin and rode over to his place and saw it for myself. There it was. A brand new truck!!!

I got close to Mr. Mutt in late 80's when he supported me to become the Recreation Director. I will never forget that opportunity. I remember the first year I had Ms. Annette Perkins as my secretary. We were fixing out the budget in 1993. After running a business, we looked for profit. I was so scared that we didn't have a profit that year. So Mr. Hunter at the time wanted all the Department Heads to come down to the county building. He wanted to review them and present the budget to him. I remember going in front in him that night. I was as nervous as a long tailed cat in a room full of rocking chairs. When I got in front of him, I was explaining our budget. We didn't make a profit that year. There was a good bit of offset. 20% short to be precise. He had a few questions at the time. He looked at Mr. Gay and Mr. Powell. I had squirmed about eight to ten minutes, and was all red faced. He said look at me "son, you are in here to serve the citizens of this county, not to make a profit".

Then later on, the ice kinda broke. He was a real big supporter of East Coweta football, and we were on a roll. He would get on the bus and ride with us eating chicken wings and watching football games. I got to calling him "stepdaddy", that's what he felt like to me. I know he is in a better place, but I am going to miss him. He not only loved this county and the employees, but he especially loved the east side of the County. One of his favorite sayings was "the sun always rises in the East". Rest in peace Stepdaddy.
