Wayne Allen Williamson, age 89, passed away January 12, 2021 at home with his daughter by his side. In 1961 he packed up his wife and young son and moved to Florida. Having the Everglades and an abundance of salt and fresh water in Florida created the perfect back drop for his favorite hobbies of hunting and fishing.

In 1996 he and his wife moved to Georgia to be near their daughter in Senoia. He often told people that of all the places that he had lived in his life Senoia was his favorite because of the people and the friends he made that became like family. He continued his love of hunting and fishing here in Georgia and

even managed to go hunting one last time during opening weekend of dove season this past September.
