



William Gregory Dailey

October 16, 1919 - September 26, 2016

The storied earthly life of William Gregory Dailey came to its end on September 26, 2016. "Bill", as he was known to all, was born October 16, 1919 in Providence, Rhode Island and was the son of the late William F. and Mary McKenna Dailey. In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by his wife, Katherine Bishop Dailey; a daughter, Theresa Meisinger; his brothers Norman and Thomas Dailey. Bill joined the Rhode Island National Guard and served from January 27, 1938 until February 23, 1941. He subsequently joined the United States Army and retired in January 31, 1961 with the rank of major. He was a Department of the Army Civilian Project Manager until 1972. An active member of St. George Catholic Church, Bill served as a Eucharist minister, lector and usher. As one dedicated to The Boy Scouts of America, he had over 50 years of service to that organization in all manner of adult services, the last being religious emblem advisor for all faiths, Flint River Council. His highest awards were BSA Order of the Arrow-Vigil, District Merit and National Silver Beaver, Catholic Church-Diocesan Pelican and Saint George. Bill is survived by his son William "Fred" Dailey and his wife Marsha of Newnan, his daughter Lois "Ginger" Sprague and her husband Kenneth of Indianapolis, IN. His sister is Eileen Bajorek of Warwick, RI. His grandchildren are Matthew (Jennifer) Dailey of Newnan, Kathy Sprague and Molly Sprague of Indianapolis, IN, Michelle Meisinger (Bob Cochran) of Warwick, RI. His great grandchildren are Bryson, Addison, Hailey, Hannah and Ashley. Funeral arrangements are by McKoon Funeral Home at 38 Jackson Street in Newnan. The family will receive friends at the funeral home on Wednesday between 5:00 PM and 7:00 PM with a rosary conducted at 7:00 PM. Holy Mass will be celebrated at St. George Catholic Church on Thursday, September 29, 2016 at 11:00 AM. Interment with military honors will be at Forest Lawn Memorial Park. 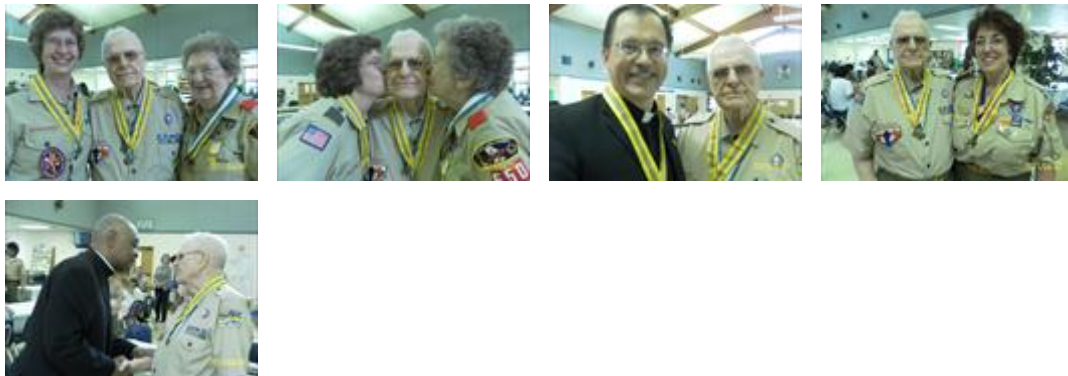
