William Dudley Hunt III of Senoia, Georgia passed away on November 23, 2024 at the age of 81. Born on May 3, 1943 in California to William Dudley Hunt II and Julia Wellborn Dauge, Dudley was raised on a farm in Alabama where he gained his love for the outdoors, farm life, and animals of all kinds.
