His remains will be transferred to a niche at Georgia National Cemetery in Canton, GA.

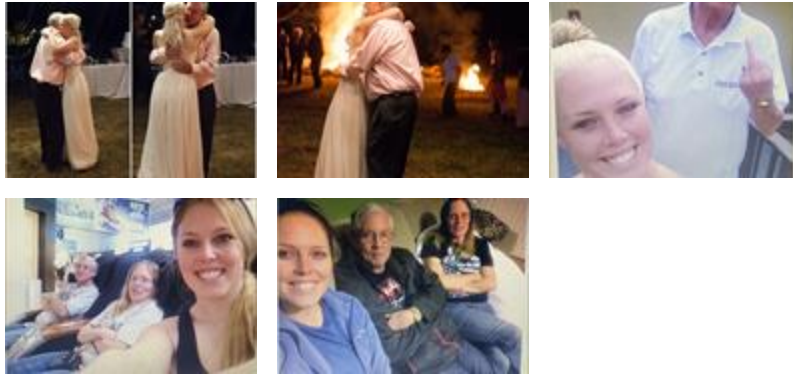
